An organizational meeting for the southwest quadrant of the Adirondacks has been announced by Gerald Edwards, chairman of the recently incorporated League for Adirondack Citizens' Rights. It is scheduled for 8 Friday night, April 18 at the Medical Center at Indian Lake

According to literature distributed by the League, which is based at Ausable Forks, Essex County, "The league will endeavor to act in the favoring of the Legislature, the Courts and public opinion to have the oppressive (Adirondack Park Agency) laws modified, and will dedicate itself to presenting the case for freedom for the people of the Adirondacks to the residents of the area, of the State and of the nation.

"It is a firm and foremost intent of this organization to foster the good care and preservation of the Adirondack region, to encourage reasonable and thoughtful controls on private and public land use consistant with Constitutional guarantees to the citizens of the Adirondacks and with major input from and authority to the people of the region."

"In addition it will be the purpose of the organization to assist in and provide leadership for the economic development of the Adirondack area, including, but not limited to, the encouragement of second home development within price reach of the average citizens of the

country."
